## Note from the Chair for the Steering Group Meeting on 9 October 2024

Dear colleagues,

At this year's successful ICN kick-off call on 18 September the working groups and project teams shared an impressive range of activities and encouraged member and NGA engagement. At our meeting on 9 October, we will start a series of working group updates, delving a bit deeper to provide all Steering Group members with the overview and insights required to guide the network.

## **Merger Working Group**

As a start, we will hear from the Merger Working Group about its activities with a focus on its work on the <u>ICN Recommended Practices for Merger Analysis</u>, which includes several updates as well as new sections. We will also hear from the ICN/OECD Liaison as the OECD is currently reviewing its Recommendation on Merger Review.

#### **Annual Conference**

The planning of the 2025 Annual Conference is well on track and very promising. The CMA will provide an update and outline the next steps. A milestone on the way to Edinburgh will be the presentation and approval of the draft conference agenda, which is planned for the Steering Group meeting in December.

### Workshops

The 2024 ICN Cartel Workshop in Mexico is running, and we will hear a very fresh report at next week's Steering Group meeting.

The Hungarian Competition Authority GVH has volunteered to host the 2025 ICN Chief/Senior Economists Workshop in Budapest from 23 to 25 April 2025 and will seek Steering Group approval.

Furthermore, we will hear a first update on the selection process for the 2025 Cartel Workshop, which involves Operational Framework issues including the scope for ICN member hosts to coordinate with non-members in hosting events. No decision will be taken at this stage.

#### NGA involvement

When the ICN was established it was decided that - as former ICN Chair Konrad von Finckenstein put it - NGAs would be welcomed and were needed given the all-encompassing nature of competition. At our meeting, we will start a first exchange regarding the current status of NGA involvement and ideas for the way forward.
